The Posple fton aff-mbled, and the Water being convenient, in shout two flours the Flames were happily extinguished, (after having entirely defiroy'd the anisds of the Houle and every Thing is it) without extening the adjoining Houses on either Side, from the two nearest of which, Cant Willet Taylor, and Mr. Stout, the Goods were removed.
