

NEW-YORK, January 6.

On Sunday Night the 29th of December, died at his House near this City, in the 60th Year of his Age, **ABRAHAM MORTIER, Esq;** Pay-Master Gen. to his Majesty's Forces in North-America, a Gentleman of a most amiable private Character, and eminently distinguished for the Uprightness and Integrity of his Conduct in his Office and all his Dealings: He was as universally esteem'd as known, and is as generally lamented. His Remains were on Tuesday Evening inter'd in Trinity Church-Yard, with all the Solemnity and Respect that could be shewn them, both by the Gentlemen of the Town and Army, a numerous Company of whom attended.
